



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## SO TEAK: QUALITY FURNITURE THAT LASTS A LIFETIME

here's no doubt Antigua's abundant sunshine can reap dividends for your health and wellbeing. Unfortunately the sun, coupled with high humidity and tropical showers, can wreak havoc on your furniture.

When decking out a new home, or renovating an existing one, it pays to ensure your prized pieces are tough enough to stand up to the unforgiving Caribbean climes. Not only is it ultimately more cost-effective to choose items that guarantee longevity, it's better for the environment too.

Two years ago, Danish couple Tom and Camilla Barnes gathered up their possessions, and a dollop of Covidinspired laissez-faire, and swapped the vibrant urban scenes of Singapore for the halcyon lifestyle of Antigua and Barbuda.

Happily for the twin island nation's residents, another thing they brought with them was a Singaporean-based outdoor living furniture business which has been in operation for more than 25 years.

The company's Antiguan offshoot SOTEAK is now in its second season and is already proving a hit with islanders nationwide.

Luxury Locations Magazine caught up with Tom to tell us more about SOTEAK's high quality teak and wicker

pieces – and why they're ideal for our sun-soaked environs.

### First things first, how did the name SOTEAK come about?

'SO stands for Scandinavian Oriental because the design is modern Danish but built with Indonesian-Oriental quality.

"From living in Singapore we have strong links with designers there who have 25 years' experience in the furniture business. They manufacture in Indonesia and export their items across the world.

"In Singapore, their pieces can be found in many private houses and condominiums, as well as hotels including the Mandarin Oriental, the Four Seasons and the Fairmont, plus a host of restaurants, because they last so well.

"While the company has been going for many years, it is completely new to Antigua."

#### What kind of items do you provide?

"One of our flagship products is a chunky live-edge solid teak table which we can do in almost any size and with a range of different table leg styles.

"We do outdoor living products, like sofas, loungers and large dining tables with chairs as well as bar stools and side tables. We also have some homeware pieces, such as lanterns and teak cutting boards. We sell single items straight from our studio on island as well as bespoke and larger custom orders for villas, refurbishments, hotels and restaurants.

"We first brought a few pieces here six years ago when my in-laws bought a family holiday home in Turtle Bay. We have personally used these products in our own homes in Singapore and Denmark as well as Antigua, so we know personally how well they last in harsh environments.

"We wanted furniture that would last forever. We realised that if we had those concerns, everybody else probably did too - and SOTEAK was born."

### What makes SOTEAK pieces so durable?

"We use teak because it lasts forever – or at least way longer than you will need it for – and it is termite-resistant.

"The wicker is also very durable. People don't believe me when I say it will last for decades. While other types of wicker get eaten alive in the sun and only last two seasons, ours is polyethylenebased and is completely UV-resistant. You can leave it outside all year round, even in the rain; we personally do and it still looks like new."





#### What about maintenance?

"Teak naturally greys so to maintain its new look it can be cleaned seasonally with a teak cleaner which we supply, before putting another coat of sealant on it.

"But even without doing that, the wood will still last. You can leave it outside for 10 years and still easily bring it back to its former glory."

#### Who are your clients?

"The reaction since we set up business has been great. We have been working with a number of large private villas,



and homeowners from all around the island who are looking to replace some particular items or even upgrade an entire living space. There have been orders from a few high-end resorts and restaurants too.

"We are also doing an entire new luxury house in Barbuda, creating everything including custom beds."

#### Where can we see your pieces?

"We have a studio in Falmouth where anyone is welcome to come in and see some of the select pieces we have in stock. Clients can arrange an appointment with me by WhatsApp to suit their schedule if needed. We are working towards also having our available on-island stock viewable online. More details and our opening times can be found on the website, where there is also a comprehensive catalogue including the range of products we can offer, along with our prices."



#### Ah yes, the prices. Expensive, right?

"They're actually more affordable than you might think. Because we bring everything in directly from the suppliers (who are also family friends) there are no middle men.

"You also have to bear in mind that the cost of shipping and taxes are already accounted for, so the prices in the catalogue are final. Taking all the extras into account, SOTEAK works out to 30-50 percent cheaper than importing - plus we will deliver anywhere on island."

### How long after placing an order can we expect to receive it?

"We have some items already in stock which can be bought directly from our studio. But we give a four to five-month lead time for big custom orders. The pieces take 45-60 days to make and roughly the same time again to ship here. Of course, the longer we have the better we can do."

### Do you work with existing homes as well as those under construction?

"Absolutely! We really have a passion for what we do and spending time with clients, helping them choose the ideal pieces to complement their home – whether they're building or just buying new furniture – is what we do best.

"We are now building our own house in Turtle Bay and I have designed it around our pieces. If you're creating your dream home, you don't want to realise

afterwards that if you'd made the living room 10 centimetres bigger you could have had the sofa you really wanted.

"It makes more sense, when spending all that time and money building something really fantastic, to put the exact furniture on the floor plan to start with.

"In our own house, we are completely blurring indoor-outdoor living so the breeze flows straight through, which makes SOTEAK pieces perfect.

"I am happy to work with architects too, so if a client is building a house I can help them plan the furniture around it. I need at least five to six months to get exactly what they want. I love that part of the business and I do that for free to ensure we get it right."

### Business aside, what made you choose Antigua to live?

"We had been coming here on holiday for more than 10 years. Covid accelerated our plans to do something totally different, so we moved straight from Singapore to here.

"The outdoor lifestyle is ideal for kids. But more than anything we liked the ambience. We have been expats for a long time; we have also lived in Japan, Australia and the UK. Settling in all those places was nice but there's a real intimate sense of community here, so we're here for the long term now!"

## FLORAL REEF ANTIGUA: FOR DESIGNS THAT ARE A CUT ABOVE THE REST



on't ask Kirsty Knoblauch to "shove some flowers in a vase". There's a good chance she'll be aghast at the notion. Creating customised floral arrangements is an art that involves understanding different types of flowers, how to take care of them and use them texturally to compose a visually appealing masterpiece.

Since Floral Reef opened its doors in October 2022, business has blossomed. The English Harbour-based outfit supplies arrangements and bouquets to homes, offices, sail boats and supervachts, with a special emphasis on wedding florals.

Multiple repeat customers are testament to the company's "incessant pursuit of quality for elegant and artistic creations, varied flower textures and tones", Kirsty

"We're original and have an eye for detail. We have great people skills and the ability to interpret and reflect the needs and styles of our clients through bespoke and conceptualised designs.

"We strive to provide high quality flowers with superior design techniques,

along with integrity and honesty." Floral Reef's tropical flowers are procured locally in Antigua, while unique and luxurious blooms are sourced from suppliers in Holland. "The process of creating a design could be as simple as a single bloom in a beautiful vase, or providing an iconic show-stopping

arrangement. Either way, the design should be emotive and memorable," Kirsty explains.

"For me, there is nothing more inspiring than working with beautiful materials in a creative way. Look around us, from our own gardens to our shorelines to the rest of this beautiful world of florals, inspiration is everywhere."

Kirsty moved to Antigua with her husband and two children from Denver, Colorado, 15 years ago and had worked in the floral industry for many years before taking the plunge to start her own business.

Her wedding designs are a particular source of pride.

"At Floral Reef every wedding is treated as individual as you are - beautiful, classic, timeless or wild," she says.

"We usually encourage focussing firstly on the bridal bouquet as we believe that's where the rest of the wedding florals stem from. Larger scale installation pieces such as large urn arrangements, driftwood arches, and mesmerising centrepieces over the small 'fiddly bits', create a real wow factor to surprise your guests, and give your photographer visual treats to capture."

Flowers are by nature a highly perishable commodity so arrangements don't come cheap.

"It is very expensive to bring flowers to the market, yet alone Antigua. Your average rose is grown in northern Kenya, harvested by hand and rapidly shipped to Holland. It is then bought by the flower wholesaler, who then sells it to Floral Reef," Kirsty explains.

"It is then once again rapidly flown on icepacks aboard British Airways to Antigua, to be prepped, hydrated, arranged and finally enjoyed in a design. Hence the cost of your average cut flower, arrangement or bouquet."

Floral Reef minimises its carbon footprint through the use of eco-friendly materials. Silk, jute, twine, hessian and raffia replace their synthetic counterparts like polyester and nylon. Harmful oasis foam is shunned in favour of chicken wire and 'floral frogs' to hold the designs in place. Kirsty



also uses organic materials to wrap her bouquets and frame her wreaths.

She adds: "We are a thoroughly conscientious business and we understand that floristry is tough on our environment, so we ensure natural resources are preserved to the best of our ability."

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
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# KEISHA SCHAHAFF: ON TOP OF THE WORLD

BOUNDARY-BUSTING ANTIGUAN ASTRONAUT TELLS LUXURY LOCATIONS MAGAZINE ABOUT HER NEW BIRD'S-EYE VIEW ON LIFE

any of us will have gazed up at the night sky and wondered what lay beyond. Very few of us will ever get the chance to find out. For Antiguan wellness coach Keisha Schahaff, those dreams became a reality last August when she and her daughter Anastatia Mayers became the first people from the Caribbean – and the first mother-daughter pair – to travel to space.

Former flight attendant Keisha was on a plane to London when she spotted an advert to win a trip aboard Virgin Galactic in a Space for Humanity raffle. Months later, she was stunned to receive an in-person visit from Virgin Galactic boss Richard Branson telling her she'd won two tickets, typically worth US\$450,000 each. Anastatia, who is studying philosophy and physics at Aberdeen University in the UK, was invited to join her and, at 18, became the youngest person to visit space.

The pair joined a crew of six on the VSS Unity for the 90-minute mission which launched from New Mexico, US. At peak altitude and zero gravity, the astronauts experienced four minutes of weightlessness at 280,000ft (85km).

Keisha tells Luxury Locations Magazine about the life-changing experience and her fresh new perspective on the world.



# Visiting space is something most of us will only dream of. How did it feel to be up there?

A feeling of peace, connection, and love; an awe-inspiring and surreal expression of, 'Wow, I'm actually here and doing this'. It was an emotional experience.

### What was it like looking back at Earth?

Seeing the Earth's curvature first-hand was a humbling and perspective-altering experience, underscoring the planet's natural beauty and the vastness of the world we inhabit. It was a remarkable and awe-inspiring experience.

### How has it changed your life?

Going to space has been a transformative experience that profoundly impacted my perspective on life. The "overview effect" created a cognitive shift in awareness, leading to a greater appreciation for the planet, a heightened sense of interconnectedness, and a deepened understanding of the fragility of our planet, emphasising the need for environmental stewardship.

I also experienced personal growth through the rigorous training and preparation for space missions, gaining a greater sense of discipline, resilience, and adaptability, which has positively impacted my life.

I feel a renewed sense of purpose and a desire to inspire others. I am also inspired to learn more about space, science, and technology. Additionally, I want to become a pilot, a dream I had when I was a flight attendant over 19 years ago. I will see how it goes.

I want to explore more and see how I can continue on this mission beyond Earth.

We have a place in the cosmos, and I want to see where this goes. I want to explore more, even on our planet, to travel more. This can lead to a broader, more expansive worldview, encouraging individuals to think beyond the confines of their immediate surroundings and consider humanity's place in the cosmos. An enhanced sense of community, a greater appreciation for the value of collaboration, empathy, and understanding in building a more connected and harmonious world.

# Your name is now known across the world. What has it been like becoming an international celebrity?

Although I still don't consider myself a celebrity, I feel humble and calm about it and am willing to share my story to inspire others as well.







# How do you plan to use your experience going forward?

I want to form a community, build a foundation, and reach out to young adults to share the experience of space, inspiring those who will take space tourism to the next level. We need space centres, starwatching, telescopes, and all space-related items on our island to keep inspiring our youth. I also want to continue spreading awareness of health and wellness, as well as the importance of caring for our planet.

### What's next for you both?

For Anastatia, it is to complete university and step into her role in space science. As for me, my place is in space exploration, astrology, astronomy, learning, and coaching retreats, promoting wellness and self-development. It all ties in.

# What does your space voyage mean for Antigua and Barbuda?

We can now step up and begin the journey, exposing our nation to space. This is good for our tourism as well. We have unpolluted skies and all conditions for wellness. I'm happy to welcome others to visit me in Antigua.

# What's been the most interesting thing you've learned during this incredible journey?

Our interconnectedness and feeling so humble knowing we are so small, living on a living planet. The feeling of peace, trust, and knowing there are much greater energies out there, and we are nothing in the vastness. Stop worrying, be kind, and protect life.

# ART GALLERY THAT CREATES A SCENE



Gilly Gobinet's enchanting space stirs the senses and captivates the soul

et among tropical gardens overlooking a seductive seascape, Gilly Gobinet's working Art Gallery offers scenes as pretty as a picture. And that's before one even begins to browse the delightful paintings on display.

Inside, one wall is devoted to an effervescent collection of paintings in acrylic of tropical flora and fauna such as bougainvillea, hibiscus, pelicans and turtles.

Gilly is one of few artists on the island who specialises in watercolours. These adorn the walls in both figurative and semi-abstract styles.

Barely a square foot of Gilly's gallery in Needs Must Circle, Fitches Creek - a short drive from the international airport - has been excluded from this bacchanalia of colour and canvas. Hand-painted murals adorn exterior walls and even the periphery of the swimming pool.

"Inspiration is never lacking when you're surrounded by all of this," she says brightly, gesturing towards her verdant garden and the ocean beyond.

Anyone wishing to browse Gilly's sundry creations will be treated to a full tour of the property, beginning with the gaily embellished hallway before heading into the bathroom which also houses several pieces. Hundreds more original works in all shapes and sizes, displayed for sale, bedeck the interior rooms, verandah and courtyard. The latter is where Gilly can usually be found at work, brush in hand.

"Most artists are recognisable by one specific style but I am extremely versatile," she says. "I can do anything from cartoons, to delicate pen and ink, to very detailed or loose watercolour and acrylic - practically anything anyone asks me to."

While most of the pieces exhibited are the result of her own impulse, much of Gilly's work is commissioned, particularly her pet portraits for which she donates 10 per cent to local animal charity Dogs and Cats of Antigua. Nearly all her paintings are suitcase-friendly, or can be shipped already stretched or rolled into a tube for convenience. Colourful greetings cards are also available.

British-born Gilly, who has lived in Antigua since 1984, adds: "What I love most is the feeling of achievement when you've created something you love - and you hope others will too."



Its turquoise waters also draw snorkellers and divers alike to its underwater marine life, however, there are plenty of land activities to pursue too, including Cedar Valley Golf Club, competing in the annual triathlon event, zip lining in the rainforest, and of course beach hopping.

# D' PARTY QUEEN:

THE FUN-PACKED FLOATING BAR SET TO REVOLUTIONISE ANTIGUA'S SOCIAL SCENE

ploading a video to social media is a surefire way to assess the public's appetite for a new hangout. A swanky restaurant perhaps, a hip nightclub - or even an impossibly cool floating bar complete with water toys, daybeds and a VIP cabana.

When Glen Hector posted a 30-second montage of his two-level, 175-person catamaran under the caption 'who's ready to party', it racked up 64,000 views in just 24 hours. Not bad in a country of less than 100,000 people.

A vision in sleek white and mahogany, D' Party Queen is the hottest new thing on Antigua's social scene and has enough exhilarating features to blow anything else on water out of it.

With three waterslides, a trampoline, and an adrenaline-inducing inflatable 'blob', it's "like a park on the sea", Glen grins.

There's a fully-stocked bar (naturally), a kitchenette with barbecue serving up wraps,

chicken wings and other snacky-type foods, a DJ booth, and bathrooms with flush toilets and changing facilities. Rooftop solar panels power all of the vessel's facilities.

Guests are brought to the boat's Valley Church mooring by tender which runs every 20 minutes from Jolly Harbour.

While Valley Church is its permanent home, D' Party Queen can also be hired for events and piloted to anywhere off Antigua's coast.

"It's multifunctional – people can charter it for weddings, birthdays, anniversaries – and it can be taken to any spot requested," Glen explains.

"We will be open every single day of the year from 10am to around sunset time, or later for private functions. People can come, have fun and enjoy good drinks and music."

The catamaran's lower level offers abundant spaces to eat, boogie or lounge while soaking up the Caribbean Sea scenes. The top deck is accessed by several sets by











stairs with the very centre home to a plush VIP section with four daybeds, each large enough for four people. This space can be rented for four hours at a time, has curtains for privacy and its own dedicated server.

In tribute to the boat's company name KaiKoconut, coconut will feature in select versions of everything from special cocktails to dishes.

Glen admits he's still a little "overwhelmed" by the arrival of the boat which took two years to build but was conceptualised six years ago.

"I have always wanted something different, something amazing, something unlike anything else in Antigua," he says.

"There is nowhere else on the west coast where you can pull up by boat, jump on and get drinks and food."

Glen is no stranger to the industry. Weeks before D'Party Queen finally made her entry into Antiguan waters late last year, his excursion company Creole Antigua Tours marked an impressive 20 years in business.

"My passion is building things; I thrive on that," Glen continues. "I designed the boat myself, as I have all my boats, and I actually helped build it too.

"It's been back-breaking and the biggest challenge of my life but the end result has been worth it."

Like all excursion firms, Glen's had a rough ride during the Covid pandemic. Not only was Creole Antigua Tours off the water for months, stifling finances, building was already underway on D' Party Queen.

"We had to stop work shortly after we began. Once we started again, the shortage of materials was immense – we were waiting for some for months. Then there were shipping and logistical issues. It was a very, very gruelling process," he says, the memory of it still clearly evident.

Glen's personal journey to reach this point is a special story in itself.

More than three decades have passed since he left his Dominican fishing village of Scotts Head and moved to Antigua "with just EC\$18 and two mangoes" in his pockets.

The cash was all he owned in the world and the fruit his only sustenance.

He can laugh at what happened next now but it was far from funny at the time.

"I was 16 years old. When I arrived at the airport, the mangoes were promptly confiscated by Customs. I then took a taxi to Potters village to meet the friend who had encouraged me to come to Antigua.

"When we got there, guess how much the taxi charged me?" he says.

"I asked him four times, 'are you sure?' He said 'yes, the fare is EC\$18'."

It wouldn't be the only setback. With no money, no job and a limited support system in a new country, hunger was omnipresent for some time.

"I believe my naval used to meet the

back of my stomach I was so hungry," he recalls.

A few casual jobs later, Glen found his feet in the hotel industry which gave him extra cash through tips and, later, in the casino in Jolly Harbour which would provide his inspiration.

"I would see the guys going out with their boats and dream of doing the same thing," he says.

In 2003, Glen's first commercial enterprise – started with his partner – was born. Creole Antigua Tours began with a 14-person pirogue which enabled holidaymakers to experience some of the island's lesser known coastal haunts. That small fishing vessel was replaced by a speed boat in 2019, followed by a large catamaran in 2019.

These days, Glen's riding the waves of his success – while continuing to make them too.

"D' Party Queen is a huge thing for Antigua. It's great for locals, their families and tourists," he says.

"The aim is for it to be a fun place where people all over the world see what Antigua has to offer and choose here to vacation."



# CHANGING LIVES THROUGH MUSIC

### THE TRANSFORMATIVE POWER OF THE COUNTRY'S YOUTH SYMPHONY ORCHESTRA

hen wet weather and dim light were not enough to deter young classical musicians from ploughing ahead with an outdoor rehearsal, Claudine Benjamin knew they were onto something special.

"It poured with rain and we were going to cancel but then the kids took out their cell phones to use as light to see their music; they were not going to be fazed," she smiles.

That soggy night back in 2018 was one of the first practice sessions for the then fledging Antigua and Barbuda Youth Symphony Orchestra, with which Claudine has been involved since inception.

Adequate rehearsal facilities were still as scarce then as instruments and teachers had been, but the enthusiasm and resolve among the nascent performers exceeded all expectations.

Seven years after its formation, the

orchestra is flying high and recently returned from a trip to the UK which included a landmark performance alongside the mighty Royal Philharmonic.

These days, the orchestra features more than 200 players, most of whom had never picked up a classical instrument before joining, much less grappled with the tricky compositions of Tchaikovsky.

It all started, as the most challenging of feats often do, with a dream.

In 2016, a previously unheard of British teenage cellist called Sheku Kanneh-Mason shot to acclaim after winning the BBC Young Musician competition.

The discovery of his Antiguan parentage galvanised Antigua and Barbuda's High Commissioner to the UK, Karen-Mae Hill, into action. Sheku and his musical family were invited to the islands to perform and assess local appetite for setting up an

orchestra. Overwhelmed by the reception from kids eager to join, organisers were determined to see the efforts through to fruition.

"We didn't have the structure, our technical ability was limited and finding people to teach was a challenge," recalls Claudine, the orchestra's chief operating officer.

"We formed partnerships across the US and UK with charitable organisations and the Kanneh-Masons were instrumental in putting us in touch with the right people.

"Everyone saw the value in what we wanted to do which was impact the lives of youngsters through music. The generosity over the years has been phenomenal – as has the level of discipline and appetite we are seeing from the kids," she adds.

Accessibility for all is at the core of the orchestra's ethos. The only requirement to





join is self-discipline. Youngsters with no transport are picked up from home so they can attend practice.

Last October, 41 players got the chance to take part in the UK tour.

"This excursion served as a remarkable catalyst for individual growth and development for each student. Immersed in a diverse array of musical performances and mentored by first-class musicians, the students gained invaluable experiences," High Commissioner Hill tells Luxury Locations Magazine.

"The journey included a prestigious performance opportunity at the Royal Academy of Music alongside the Royal Philharmonic Orchestra and the Brent Youth Pop Concert Orchestra."

The youngsters also paid a visit to the Commonwealth Secretariat and the orchestra's partners, the Commonwealth Resounds, before heading to Oxford.

"The visit to Oxford proved to be equally inspiring, featuring a tour of Oxford University and a captivating concert at the Christ Church Cathedral, accompanied by the talented choristers of the Christ Church School," Hill says.

A sojourn to Jersey followed where the

children enjoyed an inspiring collaboration with Les Quennevais School, among other things. Back in London, the students wrapped up their trip with a visit to the offices of the exam board of the Royal Schools of Music to learn about future career prospects.

"Despite a demanding schedule and challenging weather conditions, these young musicians exhibited remarkable maturity and a resilient, can-do spirit," the High Commissioner adds.

"Beyond honing their musical skills, the tour provided them with a broader perspective of the world, one they embraced with enthusiasm."

Emily James, 15, is one of many of the orchestra's success stories. She has been playing violin with the group since 2019 and describes it as "really rewarding".

"We are able to laugh and have fun while still being serious and I've made a lot of new friends," she says. "My favourite piece to play is Hungarian Dance [Brahms]. Even before I joined the orchestra I liked that piece so playing it made me so excited.

"I would tell anyone thinking about joining us to do so; it's so much fun."

For 17-year-old trombonist Orlando

Gordon, playing with the orchestra has been "cathartic".

"There are times when you want to express yourself but don't have the outlet, and luckily for me I have music as my outlet," he explains.

"It's definitely helped with my studies too. When I started with the orchestra it was like a whole different world opened up. I was forced to read and listen more and it just came together to create a different person from who I was."

Orlando is a firm believer that the talent within the twin isles' borders could one day see it open its own conservatoire.

For now, the orchestra's directors are focussing their attentions on establishing a school of music. A one-acre site in Dickenson Bay has been donated to the cause and a blueprint has been drawn up for an eight-classroom facility to teach 150 children.

"So much ability rests in our young people and that's what we exist for - to create opportunities for them," Claudine says. "Our purpose is not to entertain but to inspire and impact generations to come."

# BRAIMAH KANNEH-MASON: BREAKING BARRIERS

THE ACCLAIMED VIOLINIST SPEAKS EXCLUSIVELY TO LUXURY LOCATIONS MAGAZINE ABOUT HIS WORK WITH THE COUNTRY'S YOUTH SYMPHONY ORCHESTRA AND THE IMPORTANCE OF REPRESENTATION

From blues to soul, jazz to reggae, hip hop to calypso, the seminal influence of musicians of colour on almost every genre of music is evident.

The classical arena, however, less so.
Since arriving on the scene nine
years ago, the Kanneh-Mason clan have
been integral in helping address classical
music's diversity problem. The siblings'
2015 appearance on Britain's Got Talent
enthralled UK audiences and sparked a
chain reaction of success for the group
dubbed by notoriously acerbic judge Simon
Cowell as the world's most musical family.

Third eldest sibling Sheku would go on

to be named BBC Young Musician of the Year 12 months later, a feat followed by a performance at Prince Harry's wedding to Meghan Markle in 2018.

The fact that the Kanneh-Masons have Antiguan heritage – through their father Stuart – has seen them play a leading role in getting the country's Youth Symphony Orchestra off the ground. In April 2023, they were appointed cultural ambassadors to the twin island nation in tribute to their contributions to young islanders' musical development.

The value of role models who 'look like them' cannot be underestimated, says

violinist Braimah Kanneh-Mason, the eldest son of the seven siblings.

"It's incredibly important," he tells Luxury Locations Magazine. "The importance of representation should not be overlooked. When I was younger I wasn't aware of that."

The 26-year-old says while his father and mother – Dr Kadiatu Kanneh-Mason who was born in Sierra Leone – didn't flinch from teaching their children about painful racial history, they were careful to steer them towards positive role models.

In the absence of Black classical musicians, "they introduced us to other



Black role models to show us we could achieve anything", he explains.

Martin Luther King, Muhammad Ali and Nelson Mandela featured heavily in the siblings' upbringing.

Braimah points to cellist Jacqueline du Pré who shot to fame in the 1960s as helping inspire a new generation of female classical musicians.

"You only have to look at how many women took to the cello after her to see representation really does make a difference," he says. "We believe in the importance of that and it's very special for us to be Antiguan and to work with the Youth Symphony Orchestra."

Caribbean music comprised much of the soundtrack to the septet's childhood.

"That was a big influence; growing up we listened to a lot of calypso and soca," Braimah says.

Before taking up violin – inspired by elder sister Isata – Braimah played piano, an



instrument he believes is easier to learn due to being able to "see the notes".

"The act of holding a violin and the bow is a process that takes a while," he explains.

A graduate of London's prestigious Royal Academy of Music, he recently spent a year studying at the Franz Liszt Academy of Music in Budapest.

Asked how long it took to master the famously ticklish stringed instrument, he says he's still working on that.

"Really it's an ongoing process. You get to a point where people would consider you as having mastered it, but what you imagine for yourself changes as you grow with the instrument," he imparts.

"You get to a point where you're concert ready and you feel a general level of quality but arriving at a point where you feel you've 'completed' the instrument does not exist."

Recent years have seen a number of highs for the family, which also includes sisters Konya, Jeneba, Aminata, and





Mariatu.

Among the most pertinent moments for Braimah was the 2020 release of the 'Carnival' album, the Kanneh-Masons' first as a family.

But while some things feel like "milestones" in a conventional sense, the work with the Youth Symphony Orchestra is the most meaningful.

"That feels like a project in which we've been able to make some kind of difference. And for me that's a real personal highlight, one I am proud and grateful to be involved with," he says.

Giving back to a country with which he has familial links is a special kind of honour.

"Both my dad's parents are Antiguan so we are half Antiguan and we visited the island a lot to see family when we were younger, so we have always had that relationship with it.

"When we were first invited to come and perform in 2017 by High Commissioner Karen-Mae Hill, it was an honour to be invited by a country you feel you belong to.

"Growing up, we were always very lucky

to receive lots of generous support from people in the form of donations, teaching and their time. Without that we would not have been musicians. Giving of yourself is something we think is important to do."

Working with the orchestra is "fun" too – and eminently rewarding.

"To see how far they have come over the last few years is incredibly moving, inspiring and a testament to the students themselves," Braimah continues.

"All the students wanted to learn, were ready to work and listen. Antigua is a very musical place anyway, there's a huge legacy of music and the students have great intuition and ears.

"I feel they're now at a point of acceleration which is really exciting."

One great beauty of the orchestra is its ethos of succession planning, Braimah thinks.

"People who have been in it for a few years are now mentoring younger players. With the work ethic and drive they have, there is no reason why some could not compete for conservatoire places," he says. A network of goodwill from across the world – such as the Commonwealth Resounds, Luthiers Without Borders and the Associated Board of the Royal Schools of Music which supplied instruments, tutors and mentors, as well as invaluable training and support – has been essential to the orchestra's evolution.

"The reason it works is because there are so many hard-working people volunteering and giving their time – and so much generosity as well," Braimah adds.

"For the orchestra's UK tour, the Governor General flew out just to come to one of their concerts; it has great support from the head of state and also the Prime Minister.

"You don't see that in many places in the world. And it's another reason it's progressed so far.

"I am really happy to be involved, and can't wait to see where it goes."

# GOING FOR GOLD: TEAM ANTIGUA AND BARBUDA CLAIMS VICTORY FOR SECOND YEAR IN REGIONAL SWIM MEET

op-notch coaches and a highly competitive environment might have provided the foundation to Antigua's swimming prowess. But it's local youngsters' dedication, fortitude and determination to succeed that have propelled the sport to where it is today.

That winning formula was on heady display in November when the national team swept to victory in the 31st edition of the OECS Swimming Championships. Throw in the fact that almost a dozen of the 34-strong contingent were battling a particularly nasty bout of influenza A with accompanying respiratory symptoms and it makes their triumph all the more remarkable.

News that the team had tied with Grenada to claim the title for the second year running sparked jubilant celebrations back home. Those were magnified days later when a judging error was revealed, giving the twin island nation five extra points and an unassailable win.

The event held in St Lucia started out on a

high note, coach Wayne Mitchell told Luxury Locations Magazine.

"We got off to a really good start. Right from day one we were dropping records like crazy. The very first day was a 400m freestyle which is quite a gruelling event – you have to be super fit – and we were breaking the OECS record on that," he said.

Several members of the team smashed both national and regional records during the meer.

It's not the first time a country has won the prestigious event for two consecutive years, but if Antigua and Barbuda were to repeat the feat again next year it would go down in history.

Coach Wayne thinks it's a distinct possibility. With several of the country's finest swimmers currently overseas taking advantage of sporting scholarships, throwing them into the mix too could make the team indomitable.

Recent years have seen the sport soar to new heights with the national team defeating











the traditional stalwarts of St Lucia and Grenada. Antigua and Barbuda now boasts the fastest male in the Eastern Caribbean, along with the fastest breaststroker and freestyler.

Wayne credits such success to indefatigable local coaches.

"They have not rested," he said. "They have educated themselves on the sport and continue to do so. We also have highly competitive swim clubs. We compete in a friendly and fair way but we work hard to beat each other."

In addition to securing trophies and bragging rights, there are other benefits to be derived.

"Swimming definitely brings out confidence in the kids," Wayne continued. "We have had some go from being very sheltered and shy to hearing people cheering them on and shouting out their names. They handle it well; they're great kids and don't become cocky with it.

"It takes a lot of discipline to do this sport

and because it's so hard they respect it.

"They also do well academically at school, and later when they go off to university, because they're used to managing their time well."

Far from resting on their laurels upon their return from St Lucia, the swimmers were straight back in the pool to prepare for the next meet.

"I could not be more proud of our team," Wayne said. "I got the flu myself and it really knocked me down; I just can't imagine having to pull myself up on the block to dive in the water and swim feeling like that.

"They did it and they kept on going. It was amazing to watch; they really wanted it.

"It was 100 percent a team effort and took every single member to get this cup," he added. "They all put their soul into it and swam with everything they had."

revelry-loving residents, the summer carnival is an even bigger celebration than Christmas. Islanders go all out for the intoxicating 13-day jamboree – and last year's festivities were no exception.

# KHAN CORDICE

"Giving back is where I see my legacy"

Steel orchestras have undergone a metamorphosis since their humble roots almost a century ago when they were considered the devil's music. Back then, the discordant sounds of rudimentary 'instruments' like hubcaps and scrap metal were a far cry from the highly technical drums of today. These days, local schools, churches and resorts alike can be heard hammering out the quintessential sound of the Caribbean. Multi-award winning musical maestro Khan Cordice – the country's Director of Culture – has been at the forefront of the scene for more than two decades. Here, the 33-year-old from Point and Villa talks to Luxury Locations Magazine about giving back to the nation he loves, his hopes for the art form's future – and the intoxicating feeling of being on stage.

#### How has pan evolved over the years?

A lot. It's much more accepted now than it was even 20 years ago; there are people from what we might call the elite classes playing who would not previously have been associated with it. There's still work to be done improving our young people's music literacy but, thanks to school programmes, many of them are now going off to study music.

Internationally, there has been so much innovation, for example in Switzerland and Japan; now we even have electronic versions of the instrument.

You've done a lot of work with the Antigua and Barbuda Youth Symphony Orchestra. What's been the best part?

Seeing the growth of young people. The orchestra is filling a void we have had for a long time. It encourages excellence among young people and focus on music outside soca and calypso, while introducing them to instruments other than pan. The most warming part is seeing the number of young people wanting to join.

# You have quite a name for arranging winning compositions for the national Panorama competition. How many times have you claimed the title?

I have nine wins out of 12 times participating for arranging. If you include just playing, then plenty more.

#### Who do you attribute your success to?

I have an amazing wife; she's incredibly hard working and she keeps me grounded. I also have two daughters, aged seven and three. But my mum, Naomi Isaac, who passed away in 2015 from breast cancer, has been easily the most supportive person I've

had in my life. I would look down into the audience and see her there.

My mum was my main advisor on the songs I chose for Panorama and she wasn't a musician. I've always felt I must be able to appeal to the layman so I would bounce ideas off her. Panorama always featured a lot of 70s and 80s songs and in 2015 I wanted to change the landscape. I presented 'Sand to the Beach' to her by Menace [Antiguan soca star].

She said, this is a new song but I
think I like it; you can do some
damage with this.

We buried her a week before the competition.
So unfortunately she wasn't there to see us

win, but that one was all for her.

## What's your favourite thing to do when you're not working?

That's rare. Every week, I try to carve out time for my family. My older daughter is good at calling me out and saying, daddy you need to come and spend some time. I don't really go to bars and clubs, that's not my thing. I prefer to be at home or by a neighbour's place playing dominoes.

## How does it feel to play with a steel orchestra on stage?

The very first experience is the most exciting – and the most nerve-racking. My very first time was in 2002. I remember hearing a count to start the tune and then applause – I remember nothing in between.

There's just a burst of energy that comes over you.

If you hadn't been a musician, what might you have done?

As a child I wanted to be a doctor or a lawyer – or a police officer like my father. Later on I was very much into accounting and economics, which I have an associate degree in. But music has been at the forefront of my life, and I started travelling, representing Antigua. Otherwise I would probably have been some sort of counsellor for young people.

#### How would you like to be remembered?

As someone who gave back; that's where I see myself leaving a legacy. There were so many people that contributed to where I am today that meant I never had to spend a dollar to get there. I feel a need to give back, especially to the underprivileged. The reason I am here, as Director of Culture but also as one of the internationally renowned steel pannists from Antigua, is because of everyone who gave their time.

I've been teaching steelpan community classes since I was 14 or 15. I teach seven a week, including an adults class on Friday evening. After a long week I look forward to spending that time with them; I call them my children but some could be my grandparents. Seeing them grow has been a delight for me.

If tomorrow I leave this world, I want to feel I assisted in the development of the next generation so that steelpan can live on for another 80-plus years.

#### What makes you proud to be Antiguan?


I'm still in awe at the amount of international successes we've been able to get; my people are extremely gifted. If we
